| A few suggestion, requests accepted

## **1. Misinformation (can focus on topics in the current news cycles)**

- Topic: The Clinical Truth Rebellion: Why "Biological Illiteracy" is a Public Health Emergency.
- The Pitch: In an era of viral medical myths, Dr. Robin explains why understanding our basic biology is a matter of survival.

## **2. What Politicians Miss (can focus on current policies of interest)**

- Topic: From the Exam Room to the State Capitol: What Politicians Miss About Healthcare.
- The Pitch: Drawing on her years running a safety-net clinic and testifying at the Capitol, Dr. Robin discusses the hidden costs of healthcare ignorance and why physicians must be the bridge between policy and people.

- The Pitch: After a decade of practice, a series of health crises forced Dr. Robin to move from the clinic to the digital classroom. She discusses career reinvention, medical humility, and the power of advocating with education.

### **On Healthcare Access & Equity**

- "Medical knowledge is only as good as a patient's ability to understand it."
- "Healthcare access starts with health literacy."
- "The gap isn't in patient intelligence—it's in what we've decided to teach them."

### **On Health Education**

- "You get one body for life. You'll make decisions about it every day. Why don't we teach it that way?"
- "Understanding the body you live in isn't optional—it's the foundation of every health decision you'll ever make."
- "We teach children about continents they'll never visit, but give the human body a single chapter."

## Dr. Robin Dickinson MD

### Short Biography

Dr. Robin Dickinson MD is a family physician on a mission to democratize medical knowledge.

For over 20 years, she's moved through multiple roles in service of that mission: family medicine practice in Colorado, founder of a safety-net clinic and the first free clinic in Englewood, guest lecturer and former adjunct faculty at Rocky Vista University, health policy advocate before the Colorado State Legislature, and now digital educator.

Her work has reached 3,500+ students globally. Three physician-designed programs— MedPath, LifePath, and Making More Humans —translate her clinical expertise into accessible education that empowers families and future healthcare professionals.

# Dr. Robin Dickinson MD

Dr. Robin Dickinson, MD, is a family physician whose career has been defined by one conviction: clinical truth, taught clearly and without shame, changes everything.

## The Foundation

Born into an Air Force family, Dr. Robin moved every year until settling in Aurora, Colorado at age 6. Her path to medicine wasn't guaranteed—she came from a low-income background. But local teachers invested in her.

A high school chemistry teacher, Beth Baker-Owens, took her to visit the University of Denver and helped her secure scholarships to give her the undergrad education that would make medical school possible.

That investment shaped everything. It instilled a conviction that education should be accessible to everyone, regardless of their starting point—a belief that would define her entire career.

## The Clinical Years

Her residency in Pueblo, Colorado taught her the core belief that would guide everything: medical knowledge is only as good as a patient's ability to understand it.

For years, Dr. Robin practiced this philosophy directly. She ran a safety-net micropractice for uninsured and underinsured patients in Englewood, stripping away everything extra so she could spend an hour with each patient—time devoted entirely to teaching. She watched what people needed to understand. She saw the gaps. She observed how powerful knowledge could be when it was delivered clearly and without shame

## The Advocate

Founding Medical Director of Wellness at the Well Free Clinic in Englewood, Dr. Robin didn't just practice medicine. She built the systems required to ensure no neighbor was left behind—recruiting volunteers, creating protocols, and doing whatever it took to make care happen.

Her public voice grew alongside her clinical work. Legislative testimony before the Colorado State Legislature. Active participation on the Colorado Academy of Family Physicians' legislative committee. Regular speaking engagements with Hunger Free Colorado. Throughout it all, one message remained constant: healthcare access starts with health literacy.

Later, at Rocky Vista University's College of Osteopathic Medicine, she brought this commitment to medical education. As adjunct faculty, she taught patient interview and exam skills and created the initial lectures in the trauma-informed care series that became part of the curriculum. She now serves as a guest lecturer.

## The Stroke Survivor

In 2013, a vertebral artery dissection caused multiple cerebellar strokes. The experience was rare enough that Dr. Robin quickly found herself understanding her own diagnosis in ways that even experienced physicians did not.

What struck her most was recognizing the limits of clinical expertise in rare cases. Her physicians' authority had boundaries—and that mattered. The experience taught her something crucial: there's power in acknowledging what you don't know, and there's profound credibility in a clinician who will say so. She turned this insight into her most effective advocacy. Speaking publicly as a survivor, she modeled what it looks like when a physician is willing to be honest about uncertainty and limitation. That authenticity—not despite her medical training but because of it—became her most powerful tool for reaching people with clinical truth

## The Educator

Dr. Robin moved her "podium" from the exam room to the digital classroom. But the mission stayed the same: help the next generation understand their bodies. LifePath emerged from her observation that families needed to understand human biology the way physicians do—not as facts to memorize, but as systems to comprehend.

MedPath followed, born from watching brilliant students arrive at premed without the clinical foundation they needed. The Neurodiversity Suite grew from her family's own lived experience and decades of clinical observation about how diagnosis alone tells only part of the story.

Most recent is Making More Humans, launching June 2, 2026—physician-led puberty and sex education that replaces shame with clinical truth, grounded in her conviction that knowledge is the only real protection.

## Why It Matters

Dr. Robin has spent decades watching what happens when people don't have accurate information about their bodies. Kids who can't recognize abuse. Teens who don't know what's actually risky. Adults who can't make informed health decisions. Families blindsided by diagnoses because they didn't have the context to even begin to understand.

She knows there's a better way.

Dr. Robin holds a BA in Biology and History (with a minor in Chemistry) from the University of Denver and an MD from the University of Colorado School of Medicine. She is a member of the American Academy of Family Physicians. At Rocky Vista University's College of Osteopathic Medicine, she serves as a guest lecturer. Previously as adjunct faculty, she taught patient interview and exam skills and created the initial lectures in the trauma-informed care series that were eventually included in the primary care curriculum.
